


## Alzheimer's and Dementia Caregiver Burden is Growing in Texas (2023 Facts and Figures)

Caregivers of people with Alzheimer's and other forms of dementia face unique challenges and as dementia symptoms worsen, caregivers can experience increased emotional and physical stress making it more difficult to care for their loved ones. Many caregivers rely on direct care workers for in-home care allowing their loved one to continue living at home and help prevent or delay nursing home placement.

The Alzheimer's Association recently released its annual Alzheimer's Disease Facts and Figures report revealing the latest burden of Alzheimer's and dementia on Texas caregivers is growing. According to the 2023 Alzheimer's Association Alzheimer's Disease Facts and Figures report:

- Today, there are more than 11 million family members and friends serving as dementia caregivers, including one million caregivers in Texas.
- Fifty-nine percent of unpaid caregivers report emotional stress due to caregiving and 39% of unpaid caregivers report physical stress due to caregiving.
- The prevalence of anxiety among dementia caregivers is 44%, compared to caregivers of people with stroke (31%).
- Dementia caregivers report higher rates of chronic conditions including stroke, heart disease, diabetes, and cancer compared to caregivers of people without dementia or non-caregivers. In Texas, 59% of caregivers reported at least one chronic condition.
- The prevalence of depression is higher among dementia caregivers (30%-40%) when compared to caregivers for other conditions such as schizophrenia (20%) or stroke (19%) In Texas, 26.7% of caregivers reported depression.

Seventy-four percent of caregivers report they are "somewhat concerned" to "very concerned" about maintaining their own health since becoming a caregiver. In Texas, over 11% report frequent poor physical health.

The prevalence of suicidal ideation in dementia caregivers with a mean age of 64 was 32% compared with 2.7% in US adults age 56 and older.

The new report also looked at the number of direct care workers needed between 2020 and 2030 – an estimated 1.2 million more direct care workers are needed, which is more new workers than in any other single occupation in the United States. This projected growth in the direct care workforce is being seen across the country and in Texas. The 2023 Alzheimer's Association Alzheimer's Disease Facts and Figures report revealed:

- In 2020, there are approximately 320,780 home health and personal care aides in Texas.
- By 2030, Texas will need 418,617 home health and personal care aides, a 30.5% increase.

"This new report clearly shows that dementia caregivers need more support now and in the coming years," said Andrea Taurins, executive director of the Alzheimer's Association Capital of Texas Chapter. "The Alzheimer's Association provides support for all caregivers through our 24/7 Helpline, local support groups, care consultations and additional local resources that can help relieve some of the burdens they're facing. Most importantly, caregivers need to know they are not alone, and we are here to help."

Minority depository institutions are very different from both SVB and Signature Bank which had high concentrations in crypto deposits and volatile venture capital. Minority banks are not exposed to riskier asset classes and have the capital and strong liquidity to best serve consumers and small businesses. If you're looking for a place to bring your deposits and have greater impact, bring your deposits to minority banks" said Nicole Elam, President and CEO of the National Bankers Association.

"The Biden-Harris Administration, FDIC, and Federal Reserve worked hard this weekend to make sure that these bank failures are the exception, not the rule, and that all Americans can continue to have confidence in our banking system. I also applaud bipartisan leaders in Congress for keeping stakeholders informed about how hard-earned deposits are being kept safe." said Robert James, II, Chairman of the National Bankers Association, President & CEO, Carver Financial Corporation

The National Bankers Association is the nation's leading trade association for the country's minority depository institutions (MDIs). MDIs have always focused on safety and soundness as a part of our conservative, relationship-based business model. We continue to monitor SVB's impact on large corporate deposit concentrations, fintech, tech companies, and larger financial institutions that have partnerships with MDIs or who have made investments in MDIs.

MDIs are in the strongest position ever to support their customers and here's why:

- **Traditional Banking Model with Diverse & Secure Assets:** MDIs are diversified in terms of their assets, predominately focused on well-collateralized loans, and are not exposed to riskier asset classes. Unlike both SVB and Signature Bank, MDIs have very limited exposure to the venture capital industry and crypto.
- **Well-Capitalized and Strong Liquidity:** MDIs are in the strongest position ever. The sector is exceptionally well capitalized, enjoys substantial liquidity overall, and has grown by 33% over the last three years in total assets. Nearly \$4 billion in new, permanent capital has flowed to MDIs and currently, the median MDI common equity ratio is 16.4% versus 14.8% for non-MDIs.
- **Positioned for Impact:** 77% of MDI branches are in areas with a higher average share of minorities compared to 31% for all FDIC-insured depository institutions. According to a Dallas Fed Study in 2022, MDIs originate almost 40% of their mortgages to minority borrowers, versus only 10% by other banks. Additionally, MDIs originate 30% of small business loans to low- to moderate-income communities in comparison to 20% at community banks and 24% at large banks. Customer deposits are not only extremely safe in an MDI but are far more likely to have a positive impact in the community.
